Summary of current courses and discussed if we should expand our classes to offer fast track EMT courses or remain in the academy style. Agreed that we shouldn't and concerns were brought up over cost of testing for our students.

Update on the development of the program: Presented paramedic program to President / VP. We need to be approved by AP&P and would start in Fall 2021 and go till Fall 2022. Discussed that it is a full-time job going to school. Clinicals in hospital for medic program- AMR – students be enrolled in the internship program, charged separately to the students.

Submitted curriculum to AP&P and chancellor's office waiting for approval.

Submitting the major modification to the CTE (Margaret Lau)

Limited 24 students to the program – future goal is fast track in a hybrid coming in for only labs. If students don't get the hours they need in the fall with internship - NCSI will be training center. NAMT training center

Dave DeGroot - guided pathways – get that developed for EMS to include paramedic program. We have an associate degree in EMS but wanting to include paramedic.

We are on track and going through approvals with admin/chancellors. Developing program, getting instructors, getting the self-study. SB Cottage, AMR for internships and working on the foundation for each course.
