• EMS 301 (Basic Academy) expanding back to 40 students

- EMS 301 going from 6 units to 8 units
- 5 EMS 102 (First Aid & Safety) held each term
- EMS 102 expanded into the high schools starting at Orcutt Academy in Spring 2023
- Training center for BLS run 12-15 classes a year at AHC along with outreach CPR courses
- Wilderness First Responder been successful, great facility take students out opportunity to build buildings and use a compass
- EMS 199 (Special Topics) creative way to add courses
- EMS 199a: ECG basic interpretation, pharmacologic interventions, electrical interventions

- 2 semester full-time program (are extended/start early) after completing students can attempt their NREMT written and skills to obtain their NREMT EMT-P Paramedic license
- Conflict for clinicals: Need clinical exposure at Marian. WE have cottage, some clinics agree to peds, and Lompoc which is awesome. Weren't running paramedic, Cuesta running clinics at Marian in Fall. Marian would be over saturated with number of students only option is to do our clinicals internships in Spring. No choice but delay start to Fall 2023 due to lack of ability to do clinicals at Marian. Need feedback
- Richard Algre suggested to contact Cuesta program head and express our challenges and needs and see if they are willing to accommodate
- Suz hardest thing is to get students the appropriate exposure
- Sebastian students have a need to get a quality clinical exposure in hospital setting have seen some hospitals reserve only to county academic programs
- Jennie thinks its important we pursue working with Marian was the local students being priority as much as possible. Cottage has 3 hospital limited potential exposure at SLO and Goleta. You Need bigger hospital incidents you won't find at smaller ones. I believe most of your students are from Lompoc and Santa Maria area, having that access and exposure t local hospitals and hope to get them into local jobs and roles is in there and our best interest in the long-term. Conversations with Cuesta and Marian finding a half way point so our program is not limited so we could potentially have the flexibility to have students at Marian in Fall semester
- Brian LVMC grateful of paramedic students, shouldn't ger held up by EDD Directors. I would imagine that Marian and Christine with their volume they could handle at least two students in the busiest times
- Patrick thinks to prioritize students in county
- Daniel Shepherd just doubled EMT spots in emergency dept spot reach out to Angeli Mancuso. Cottage doesn't traditionally have a lot of student may be a good opportunity to discuss all 3 sites how we can come up with spots.
