HUSV 110: Culturally Responsive Curriculum

Chapter 1: The Role of the Mental Health Professional in Prevention and Treatment

Activity: Exploring Stereotypes and Biases Against Substance Use Disorder This activity aims to create a safe and reflective environment for students to examine and challenge their preconceived notions about substance use disorder, ultimately fostering a more compassionate and informed perspective.

Chapter 2: Classification of Drugs

Activity: Assign students a drug classification for them to research questions using this <u>Fentanyl</u> <u>resources</u>

Lecture: Provide the updated <u>classification</u> schedule of drugs.

Discuss the importance of the fentanyl epidemic, which is not noted in the textbook, and show Benzo Dope and Trang: The Next Wave of the Overdose Crisis

Chapter 3: Models of Addiction

Activity: Watch Everything you think you know about addiction is wrong | Johann Hari | TED and discuss how it relates to the models of addiction we have covered in lecture. Discuss which model(s) it highlights or integrates.

Chapter 4: Culturally and Ethnically Diverse Populations

Activity: Analyzing the Importance of Cultural Adaptation in Substance Abuse Treatment. Students will read the two short articles and discuss the importance of cultural adaptation in Substance Use Disorder Treatment.

This activity aims to deepen students' understanding of the crucial role cultural adaptation plays in substance abuse treatment and to equip them with the knowledge and strategies needed to provide culturally competent care.

Lecture: Add in conversations of the <u>5 of the world's most mind-bending drug cultures</u> in addition to the drugs that are mentioned in the text.

Chapter 5: Confidentiality and Ethics

Activity: <u>You're Doing It Wrong: The evolution of cultural competence | Raquel Martin | TEDxRutgersCamden</u>. Discuss why what is presented in the video is significant to following ethical codes.

Lecture: Watch <u>Common Dilemmas in the Ethical Treatment of Inpatients with Substance Use Disorders</u> and have students brainstorm or share other possible experiences for specific marginalized groups that suffer from addiction.

Chapter 6: Screening, Assessment, and Diagnosis

Activity: Recognizing and Addressing Stereotypical Bias for addicts in Healthcare:

- This activity aims to create awareness and understanding of the pervasive issue of stereotypical bias in healthcare and to equip students with strategies to recognize and mitigate these biases to provide equitable treatment for all patients.
- Case studies will be provided that highlight varying demographics and cultures, students will analyze the treatment they are receiving based on the individual's qualities that are presented.

Chapter 7: Motivational Interviewing and Brief Interventions

Activity: Read Culture and motivational interviewing

- provide students with practical experience in adapting motivational interviewing techniques to effectively support individuals from diverse and marginalized backgrounds seeking help for addiction.

Chapter 10: Relapse Prevention

Activity: Highlighting Relapse Prevention Approaches for Different Groups

- To help students understand the importance of tailoring relapse prevention strategies to different groups and practice developing these strategies.
- provide students with practical experience in developing and implementing relapse prevention strategies tailored to the needs of diverse and marginalized populations.
- Students will develop an assessment of client needs and relapse prevention for the group they are assigned.

Lecture: Review lesson and article below to discuss the many factors that contribute to substance abuse and the need for acknowledgement for specialized treatment and prevention.
