If you have not had a chance to ask me questions via the Canvas Inbox, here's your chance to submit something via this activity. Maybe you have a question about a video you've seen, or one of the assigned readings or lecture videos. Maybe there's a personal experience you have and you are trying to make a connection to something you have encountered in our class and have a question about. The goal of this assignment is for you to feel comfortable to ask questions that matter to you about our course and that you would like an answer for. Follow the instructions to help you earn full credit for this activity.

#### Instructions:

- 1. Post two (2) questions related to our course content and material that you have. If folks have posted before you, make sure you read through their questions to avoid a repetition of the same question. Avoid asking yes or no questions, write out questions that are thoughtful and demonstrate how you are engaging with the course.
- 2. Answer one (1) of the questions posted by your classmates. Pick a question you feel compelled to answer or respond to. I am not looking for the "right" answer, but rather to see how each one of you are critically analyzing and thinking about our readings, lectures, and videos.
- 3. I will answer all of your questions as they are posted, therefore do not forget to come back and check for answers. I want to make sure that your questions receive answer, and if you have a follow up, feel free to post that one as well.

#### Rubric

- 2 engaging and thoughtful questions about course content and materials: 10 points
- 1 reply to a classmate's question, demonstrating a thoughtful response: 5 points

If you have not done this before with an instructor, then take the opportunity to engage with me and check in. I look forward to hearing from you.

## Instructions: How to Receive Full Credit (Follow Step-by-Step)

For this assignment, you will use the Padlet wall below and at least two-to-three sentences describing how you are doing and/or expressing in what ways I can offer support prior to the conclusion of our course. Also, if you are graduating, transferring, completing a certificate program, or want us to celebrate an accomplishment (academic or non-academic) with you, let us know. Read the instructions carefully on how to post and submit this assignment. I've also included my own sticky note as a sample:

- 1) Click on the circle with the plus (+) sign in the bottom right corner of the Padlet.
- 2) A Post-It/Sticky-note will pop up.
- 3) In the "Subject" line, type your name, you can write your full name, for example "Juan Reyes" or your first initial and last name for example, 'J. Reyes'.
- 4) Include an image/gif/meme. Under the Subject line, you will see icons to either upload an image, take a picture, upload a gif etc. Include an image, a gif, a YouTube video, meme, or link to go with your Post-It. Pick whatever you think adds a great visual to your words.
- 4) In the area where it says, "Write something fantastic..." Type out how you are doing at the end of this semester and if there are any accomplishments you would like for us to celebrate with you.
- 6) Once you are done, you can click "Publish" button on the top right and the Post-It, and it will attach to the Padlet board on its own. If you would like to re-do your Post-It, click on the three side dots on the top right of your work, and press "edit". Be Careful and Do Not Delete/Change anyone else's work.
- 7) When you have posted your sticky note. Go to the top right corner of your screen and click on the blue button "Start Assignment", a text box will appear below the Padlet wall. In the text box write the word "Done!", then click on blue button "Submit Assignment"; this will help verifying that you have correctly completed your work.
