Chapter 1: An invitation to Social Psychology

• **Lecture**: Discussion of individualist and collectivists. What is normal is relative to one's culture. How does this impact alternative views?

Class Activity:

Chapter 5: Social Attribution: Explaining Behavior

Class Activity:

Read articles prior to class. Students will group up and discuss their readings, their former impressions, something new they learned, and anything that they relate to. They will then research and come up with positive interventions that they will present to the class.

Chapter 9: Social Influence:

• Class activity: Negative effects of Conformity and Obedience on special populations
Choose a group that has experienced a historical or recent event that displays instances of hate speech, hate crimes, bullying, minimizing of experiences and trauma, intentional lack of resources, and identify explicit and implicit biases towards that group. Analyze how these issues have been exacerbated and accepted by a larger population and why they may remain an issue presently. How does conformity and obedience play a role in it?

Chapter 10: Relationships and attraction

Lecture:

Discuss cultural differences in marriage, compatibility/love vs. arranged marriage/cultural acceptance.

<u>Social Media's impact on relationships</u>: Read article and express your personal experience with social media and any impact it has had on your relationships, whether it is with family, friends, yourself, or a partner.

Chapter 11: Stereotyping, Prejudice, and Discrimination

• **Lecture**: Add documentary into lecture discussion and write key takeaway from video to share with the class. Student will identify something they didn't agree with, and challenge themselves with an alternative point of view.

• Class Activity: Peer interviews

Find someone and interview them, asking 3 questions. Has anyone ever judged you based on your looks. Have you felt you have lost out on opportunities because of your age, sex, gender, race? How has being judged affected your views of yourself?

Chapter 12: Groups

• Discussion Board:

Listen to <u>NPR interview</u> and discuss the differences and similarities of the 1992 riots of LA and the George Floyd protests. Given history, do you think that it is necessary for civil unrest or peaceful protests to occur?

Chapter 13: Aggression

• Lecture: Focus on Culture of Honor and facilitate discussion-

Regarding the culture of honor, why do you believe there are differences in aggressive behavior, still present today, between people in the northern states and those in the southern states?

• **Discussion Board:** Interpretation of Aggression

We have discussed the cultural differences in aggression and gender. Discuss a time when you have witnessed aggressive behaviors aimed at a certain group or individuals and how that aggression was expressed OR a time when you may have interpreted a person's act of aggression as intentional, but later considered situational factors and changed your mind.

Chapter 14: Altruism and Cooperation

• Lecture: Watch So You Think You Understand Homelessness

Examine preexisting thoughts of individuals who are homeless. Discuss the reality of housing insecure individuals and the lack of empathy they experience. Watch video and revisit initial thoughts.

Activity:

Students will be tasked to find an opportunity to help someone, by volunteering, lending a hand to help, listening to someone who is struggling, providing resources to someone who is without, etc. They will record their experience and write a reflection about the result of their help and support.
