Based on the survey results, staff created a Board Demographic/Attribute Profile Matrix that will be helpful as we continue to recruit more board directors. Currently, we have 16 board directors and four will be terming off in January 2025. We also gathered more information regarding which committees and positions directors have an interest in.

Another area to point out is that most who submitted the survey would like to continue with six meetings per year (6 vs 3) and the majority expressed that at the discussion meetings, they would like to hear about academic programs and trends in community college education. The top board development topics included soliciting financial support, advocacy, state of higher education, and strategic planning.

A RESOLUTION OF THE ALLAN HANCOCK COLLEGE FOUNDATION BOARD OF DIRECTORS

RECOMMENDATION TO NAME THE LAHR FAMILY BOARDROOM

WHEREAS, the Donald Lahr Family of Santa Maria, California, has demonstrated extraordinary loyalty, commitment, and support for the mission and effectiveness of Allan Hancock college, and

WHEREAS, Donald Lahr, Sr., attended Allan Hancock College in the 1930s, was a successful businessman, and served as Mayor of Santa Maria (1998-2000), and

WHEREAS, Doris Lahr served on the Board of Directors for the Allan Hancock College Foundation, where she was a member of the President's Circle and stewarded the Lahr Family Scholarship Endowment. Doris was also proud to make the inaugural gift to the Hancock Promise Campaign to provide two years of tuition for rising high school graduates, and

WHEREAS, all four of their children - Don, Larry, Jeffery, and Thomas - attended Allan Hancock College, and

WHEREAS, Donald Lahr, Jr., established the Lahr Industrial Welding Scholarship that provided scholarship funds to dozens of students training as welders in the region, and

WHEREAS, Larry Lahr served for more than 26 years (1994-2022) as an elected trustee of Allan Hancock College, serving as president of the board four times. As president in 2006, he oversaw the successful passage of the Measure I bond, which provided funds for much-needed capital improvements to campus including the new industrial technology complex, the public safety training center in Lompoc, and the Fine Arts Complex and Boyd Hall that opened in 2022, and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Allan Hancock College Foundation Board of Directors do hereby recommend that the Allan Hancock College Board of Trustees rename the Board Room in Building B to the Lahr Family Board Room to honor the Lahr Family's extraordinary involvement with and contributions to the vitality of Allan Hancock College.
