Directors' Annual Scholarship: Foundation board members for the last seven years have provided contributions of \$25 or more for the awarding of an Allan Hancock College Foundation Board of Directors Scholarship. This award is presented at the annual scholarship awards banquet in May. Committee members agreed to continue the tradition of the scholarship and will present to the full board for their review and approval at the February 11, 2016, board meeting.

New Position – Advancement Specialist: In fall 2014, Allan Hancock College was awarded a 5-year Hispanic Serving Institutions grant (Title V) from the U.S. Department of Education. The grant focuses on two major activities, one of which is to implement structural changes to coordinate, align, and integrate the college's multiple resource development components. This "capacity development" grant provides an opportunity to restructure units into a coordinated College Advancement program and to add an Advancement Specialist to assist with development activities. This position will be incrementally institutionalized with district funds over the remaining four years of the grant's project period. Beginning in 2019, this position will be institutionalized as a foundation position. It is anticipated that the return on investment will outweigh the cost of the position.

It is the recommendation of the Nominations Committee to have directors continue his or her current committee assignment for 2016 with the hiring of the new Executive Director for College Advancement. New directors will review and provide staff with the committee they wish to serve on for 2016.

College Trustee Appointments for 2016: At the December 2015 annual organizational meeting of the Allan Hancock College Board of Trustees, Greg Pensa (primary) and Hilda Zacarías (alternate) were once again appointed to serve on the foundation board as trustee representatives for 2016.

Foundation Employee Handbook: The foundation has the first draft from Human Resources and will be reviewed by staff and the President's Office.

Report on Foundation Activities: Dr. Kevin Walthers reported that the second part of the Marcled Foundation grant of \$50,000 for the college's Career Integration Initiative was received. The foundation also received an estate gift of \$25,000 from the Virginia S. Miller Trust and with the -1.4

recommendation of the foundation's Finance Committee, the gift was directed for the STEM Endowment that will be federally matched. Dr. Walthers said we are only \$5,000 away from our goal to reach the full amount we need for the STEM endowment. He also reported that contributions from the end-of-year appeal letter have been coming into the office. Dr. Walthers also reported there will be a luncheon for new directors and executive committee on January 14, 2016, starting at 11:30.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Each year the Investment Committee develops a proposed operating budget for the upcoming fiscal period. Staff develops a preliminary draft budget which includes the current year approved budget and a proposed budget for the upcoming fiscal period using projections for both revenue and expense. The following narrative represents those staff projections as applied to the budget development:

#### REVENUE

- Unrestricted Contributions gifts to the unrestricted fund.
- Unrestricted Interest The Morgan Stanley Active Assets and the Consulting Group Advisor accounts generate the interest earnings from the pooled unrestricted and temporarily restricted funds.
- Administration Fee The administration fees of 1.5% on the endowment pool.
- **President's Circle** Revenue to the Allan Hancock College Foundation of \$10,500 based on the assumption of total revenue of \$75,000 President's Circle. (The foundation receives 15% fee on all President's Circle gifts.)
- Consulting Group Advisor, Gain/Loss & Dividends The original \$500,000 investment was held in low interest bearing certificates of deposit and money market accounts into a higher performing investment.
- Marian Hancock Trust restricted fund The trust establishes its quarterly distributions on July 1 each
  year per tax code regulations. The distribution from the trust can change year-to-year based on
  economic conditions.
- F. Young Endowment A unrestricted gift and is designated as a "quasi-endowment".

#### **EXPENSES**

- Staff Salaries & Benefits
- a. The foundation will continue to pay the district \$50,000 of the Executive Director's salary.
- b. Proposal #1 is based on a 2.5% COLA increase for staff and the Administrative Assistant position remaining part-time status.
- c. Proposal #2 is based on a 2.0% COLA increase for staff and the Administrative Assistant position becoming full-time.
- d. The Advancement Specialist position is a part of Staff Salaries & Benefits. The position's base salary is \$60,000, benefits is \$4,100, payroll taxes is \$6,462.65—the total for salary, benefits and payroll taxes is \$70,562.65. The position is funded through the Title 5 grant and the district will reimburse the foundation.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The foundation's operating budget is a function of the unrestricted assets of the corporation. The proposed 2016-17 operating budget reflects an increase of approximately 28%.

The proposed 2016-17 operating budget is being presented today for review, discussion and approval.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Finance Committee members will review with a recommendation to be forwarded to the Executive Committee, and the full board for approval at the Board of Director's quarterly meeting on April 28,

2016. Upon review and agreement, the proposed 2016-17 operating budget is being presented today for approval with a motion needed to approve

- Proposed Budget #1 with projected revenue of \$303,813; total general operating expenses of \$327,262.
- Proposed Budget #2 with projected revenue of \$303,813, total general operating expenses of \$340,214.

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#### **BACKGROUND**

ALLAN HANCOCK COLLEGE FOUNDATION

In fall 2014, Allan Hancock College was awarded a 5-year Hispanic Serving Institutions grant (Title V) from the U.S. Department of Education. The grant focuses on two major activities, one of which is to implement structural changes to coordinate, align, and integrate the college's multiple resource development components. This "capacity development" grant provides an opportunity to restructure units into a coordinated College Advancement program and to add an Advancement Specialist to assist with development activities. This position will be incrementally institutionalized with district funds over the remaining four years of the grant's project period. Beginning in 2019, this position will be institutionalized as a foundation position. It is anticipated that the return on investment will outweigh the cost of the position.

A schedule for the recruitment and hiring for the position is being coordinated through the foundation and the Office of Institutional Grants.
