




Jobs (2023)





Most Jobs are Found in the State Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals **Industry Sector**













Retirement Risk Is About Average, While Overall Diversity Is High




Retirement risk is about average in your area. The national average for an area this size is 208* employees 55 or older, while there are 203 here.



Occupation Age Breakdown



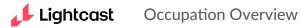


Occupation Race/Ethnicity Breakdown



Includes deputy sheriffs and police who spend the majority of their time guarding prisoners in correctional institutions.
