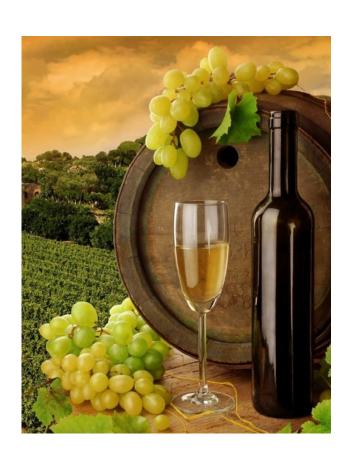

BACKGROUND

The donations below are in support of the Allan Hancock College Viticulture & Enology Program. All products donated will be used in the winery and the agribusiness program.

- On May 8, 2019, Nutrien Ag Solutions, Inc. donated 40 oz. of Rally, 10 gal. of Stylet Oil, 30 oz. of Quintec, and 1 gallon of Inspire Super 4X1GA.

BACKGROUND

In order to be able to demonstrate and provide students with practice in different wine varietals and styles we purchase grapes that are not planted in our vineyard. These grapes complement our wines and blends in varietal differentiation or make for a quantity needed for specific objectives.

In this particular case Albarino will be used to produce in the new cement tank, Grenache blanc is an upcoming varietal and Cabernet franc and Syrah will complement our red blends in quality and quantity.

Albarino: This is part of an agreement where we receive a donation of grapes for an estimated value of \$4,000 and we purchase 1 ton of grapes at \$2,000.

Grenache blanc: These grapes are a varietal that is in growing demand and becoming more popular. We would like to have it at the winery so that our students can practice with it.

Cabernet franc and Syrah: These grapes are from Santa Barbara County from different varietals or clones that complement our wine blends.

FISCAL IMPACT

The purchase of the Albarino would have a positive impact of \$2,000 and the purchase of the other grapes would have a negative impact of \$3,800. Total net fiscal impact of expense of \$1,800.

BACKGROUND

Wine production activities will encourage students to produce commercially recognized wines while experiencing all aspects of the wine industry, from growing the grapes through compliance and consumer service.

The campus winery produces around 800 cases per year mainly from campus vineyard but also from donated and purchased grapes. Sales are primarily from our tasting room incorporated inside the campus winery and to a few retail and supermarket stores. Currently the tasting room is open every Friday from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., occasionally Thursdays and one Saturday per month. Students have an authentic learning opportunity when a commercial product has exceeded market expectations. Many of the wines have won medals in California Orange Wine County Competition (the largest competition for California wines) and exceeded 90 points in the media. This provides students with a hands-on invaluable experience that translates into more prepared students for the industry today.
