

4.A. Current 2020 & 2021 Bulk Wine

K. Norris provided an inventory update on the 2020 and 2021 vintage bulk wine and said the counts were taken towards the end of November. K. Seyfert suggested forthgoing to add the dates in the board item as part of the background language. White and Rose will be bottled July 2022, and Red will be bottled July 2023.

4.B. Short-Term Winemaking Operations Plan

4.C. Winery Tasting Room Update


