

3. Action Items

3.A. Approval of December 15, 2015 Meeting Minutes

3.B. Decision on Disposition of Files Currently Retained at Kirk & Simas

On a motion by Kevin Walthers, seconded by Larry Lahr, the Foundation board approved transferring all files to the new firm, Simas Taylor LLP. (Ayes: Black, Koch, Lahr, Walthers; Noes: None; Absent: Dal Bello)

4. <u>Information Items</u>

4.A. Financial Report

Michael Black reviewed the balance sheet and the income statement for the Viticulture and Enology Foundation for the period ending January 31, 2016. Dr. Walthers noted that inventory is not reflected. Mr. Black will research the appropriate accounting method and reporting format.

4.B. Budget Discussion

Michael Black reviewed the budget development process for the 2016-17 fiscal year.

He discussed budgeting for program needs, such as student workers, and estimating potential income from sales and fundraising. Alfredo Koch stated that program review indicated the need for a lab tech or assistant.

4.C. Donation Report

Alfredo Koch reported that the Viticulture and Enology Foundation received the following donations: \$500 from the California Strawberry Commission, \$2,000 from the Santa Barbara Vintners Foundation, \$200 from the Santa Maria Club, and \$1,000 from California Women for Agriculture.

4.D. Winery Inventory Report

Michael Black reviewed the inventory report as of March 8, 2016. Dr. Walthers suggested adding a column to reflect change. Mr. Black would like it based on cost rather than price. Larry Lahr pointed out the need to reconcile physical and book inventory. Discussion followed on selling, marketing, and donating the wine.

4.E. Upcoming Events

Alfredo Koch reported that the Spring Wine Sale will be held on May 7 at the AHC winery and the Rancho Vino fundraiser will be on September 10 at Presqu'ile Winery.

4.F. *Name That Winery* Contest

Alfredo Koch updated the board on the campus-wide contest to name AHC's winery and wine label that was "uncorked" on February 19 and will close on March 30. All suggestions will be forwarded to the Foundation board for review and consideration.

5. New Business

Dr. Walthers shared that the president of Las Positas College is interested in visiting to see what we are doing. They are not a bonded winery but want graduates from their program.

Alfredo Koch explained there are six to 12 graduates per year but many students. The department has been streamlining its degrees and would like to offer a winemaking degree.

Larry Lahr suggested a future board presentation on the viticulture and enology program.

Alfredo Koch adjourned the meeting at 4:19 p.m.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

The Board of Directors Allan Hancock College Viticulture and Enology Foundation Santa Maria, California

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the Allan Hancock College Viticulture and Enology Foundation (the Foundation) (a California nonprofit corporation), which comprise the statement of financial position as of June 30, 2015, and the related statements of activities, cash flows, and functional expenses for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Foundation's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Foundation's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Opinion

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Allan Hancock College Viticulture and Enology Foundation as of June 30, 2015, and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JUNE 30, 2015

NOTE 1 - NATURE OF ORGANIZATION AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization

The Allan Hancock College Viticulture and Enology Foundation (the Foundation) (a California nonprofit corporation) was incorporated in the State of California in 2014 as a nonprofit public benefit corporation. The Foundation was organized to support Allan Hancock Joint Community College District's (the District) educational and cultural programs in areas of Agribusiness, Viticulture and Enology, as well as operate certain facilities related to such programs. The Foundation is a Voluntary Health and Welfare Organization as defined by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards of Codification (ASC) Topic 958.

Financial Statement Presentation

The Foundation prepares its financial statements on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The financial statements include the accounts maintained by and directly under the control of the Foundation.

The accompanying financial statements are presented in accordance with FASB ASC 958-210-50. Under ASC 958-210-50, the Foundation is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted, temporarily restricted, and permanently restricted. In addition, the Foundation is required to present a statement of cash flows. The Foundation does not use fund accounting. Revenues and expenses are recorded when incurred in accordance with the accrual basis of accounting. At fiscal year end, the Foundation only had unrestricted net assets.

The Foundation and the District are financial interrelated organizations as defined by ASC Topic 958-605, Transfers of Assets to a Nonprofit or Charitable Trust that Holds Contributions for Others. Under ASC Topic 958-605, the Foundation reflects contributions received for the benefit of the District as revenue in its financial statements. The expenses related to these contributions are accounted for under program and supporting services.

Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of equity and debt securities with readily determinable fair values approximates their respective quoted market prices. Because of the inherent uncertainty of valuation methods, those estimated values might differ significantly from those used had a market existed. All other financial instruments' fair values approximate their carrying amounts due to the short maturities of these instruments.

Support and Expenses

Contributions are measured at their fair value at the date of contribution and are reported as an increase in net assets. The Foundation reports gifts of cash or other assets in the category designated by the donor. The Foundation reports gifts of goods and equipment as unrestricted support unless explicit donor stipulations specify how the donated assets must be used. Absent explicit donor stipulation about where the contributions are to be spent, the Foundation reports these contributions as unrestricted.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JUNE 30, 2015

Donated Services, Goods, and Facilities

Donated services, goods, and facilities are not reflected in the financial statements since there is no readily determined method of valuing these services.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Classification of Current and Noncurrent Assets and Liabilities

The Foundation considers assets and liabilities that can reasonably be expected, as part of its normal operations, to be converted to cash or liquidated within twelve months of the statement of net assets date to be current. All other assets and liabilities are considered noncurrent.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash held in checking with maturities of less than 90 days. The Foundation maintains cash balances in financial institutions which are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) up to \$250,000. At June 30, 2015, the Foundation's deposits were fully insured.

Income Taxes

The Foundation is a charitable, not-for-profit, tax-exempt organization qualified under provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and corresponding California provisions. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes has been provided in the financial statements. The Foundation has also been classified as an entity that is not a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509(a) and qualifies for deductible contributions as provided in Section 170(b)(A)(vi). The Foundation annually files information returns, Forms 990, 199, and RRF-1, with the appropriate agencies. There was no unrelated business activity income.

The Foundation has adopted FASB ASC Topic 740 that clarifies the accounting for uncertainty in tax positions taken, or expected to be taken, on a tax return and provides that the tax effects from an uncertain tax position can be recognized in the financial statements only if, based on its merits, the position is more likely than not to be sustained on audit by the taxing authorities. Management believes that all tax positions taken to date are highly certain and, accordingly, no accounting adjustment has been made to the financial statements.

Allocation of Functional Expenses

The costs of providing the various programs, fundraising, and other activities have been summarized on a

functional basis in the Statement of Functional Expenses. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and operating activities.
