Comparisons and contrasts clarify a situation

by pointing out similarities and differences.

Comparing: to point out similarities

Contrasting: to point out differences.

ORGANIZATION

Let us <u>contrast the **usefulness** of a motorcycle with that of an automobile.</u>

We will base our contrast on expense, upkeep, and safety.
